DR. ROD HALL, DVM

Dr. Hall was raised on small beef and dairy farms near Ada, Oklahoma. He did his pre-veterinary work at East Central University in Ada and graduated with a D.V.M. degree from Oklahoma State University in 1977. He practiced in Alva, OK for one year before opening a mixed animal practice in Tishomingo, OK in 1978.

He joined Animal Industry Services in the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, & Forestry in December 2006. As a staff veterinarian he worked mainly with the Brucellosis, Tuberculosis, Trichomoniasis, Johne's Disease, and Livestock Market Inspection programs. He was named State Veterinarian in June 2011. He is a member of American Veterinary Medical Association and Oklahoma Veterinary Medical Association where he was named Oklahoma Veterinarian of the Year at the 2016 Annual Convention.

With a specific focus, Matt formed Makens Weather, LLC in 2016 and grew quickly by providing actionable weather and climate information, clearly communicated. The primary focus is on long-term seasonal forecasts and short-term weather hazards for the agricultural industry. Makens Weather has served global clients from Australia to Canada and the United States.

FROM CARCASS TO CUT: INNOVATIONS IN RED MEAT YIELD



DR. GRETCHEN MAFI

Gretchen Mafi is a Professor and the Ralph & Leila Boulware Endowed Chair in the Department of Animal and Food Sciences at Oklahoma State University. She teaches undergraduate and graduate courses in meat science and conducts research focused on meat cutability and quality. Gretchen earned her bachelor's and Ph.D. degrees from Texas Tech University and her master's from Colorado State University. She teaches three to five courses each semester, advises students, and has published over 100 scientific articles.

In addition to her academic work, Gretchen coaches the Oklahoma State Meat Judging Team and has received several prestigious awards, including the AMSA Signal Service Award (2021), USDA Excellence in Teaching Award (2020), and AMSA Distinguished Teaching Award (2019). She has also served as President and Board Member of the American Meat Science Association. Gretchen and her husband, Jeff Mafi, live on their farm in Coyle, Oklahoma, where they raise purebred Angus cattle.



Dr. Dale R. Woerner is the Cargill Endowed Professor of Sustainable Meat Science in the Department of Animal and Food Sciences at Texas Tech University. He earned both his B.S. (2003) and M.S. (2005) degrees in Animal Science from Texas Tech University, followed by a Ph.D. in Animal Science with a focus on Meat Science from Colorado State University in 2009. Dr. Woerner served as a faculty member at Colorado State University for nine years before joining the faculty at Texas Tech University in 2018. Over his career, he has secured more than \$15 million in industry-funded research and has published over 300 scholarly works, including peer-reviewed manuscripts and technical reports in the field of meat science.



KELLY RETALLICK

Kelli Retallick-Riley currently serves as the president of Angus Genetics Inc. (AGI), a subsidiary of the American Angus Association[®] where she leads the company's genetic evaluation technology and research programs. Retallick-Riley previously served as the served as the director of genetic and genomic programs and the director of genetic service at AGI. Kelli is a graduate of the University of Wisconsin-Madison and earned her master's degree at Kansas State University where she also worked closely with scientists at the US Meat Animal Research Center in Nebraska.

DR. DERRELL PEEL

Derrell Peel is the Charles Breedlove Professor of Agribusiness in the Department of Agricultural Economics. He has served as the Extension Livestock Marketing Specialist since he came to Oklahoma State University in 1989. He has B.S. and M.S. degrees from Montana State University and a Ph.D. from the University of Illinois. He previously served as the Superintendent of the Southeastern Colorado Range Research Station in Springfield Colorado. His main program areas at Oklahoma State University include livestock market outlook and marketing/risk management education for livestock producers. Derrell also works in the area of international livestock and meat trade with particular focus on Mexico and Canada and the North American livestock and meat industry. He lived in Mexico on sabbatical in 2001 and has developed an extensive knowledge of the Mexican cattle and beef industry and the economics of cattle and beef trade between the U.S. and Mexico.

Andrew is a passionate advocate for the use of technology on ranches to improve productivity, profitability, and the management of natural capital.

After an extensive executive career in capital markets and funds management he has spent the last seven years in the Agritech sector mentoring emerging technology companies as an Investor, Adviser and Company Director. He is the Co-Founder and CEO of Farmbot Monitoring Solutions and Ranchbot Monitoring Solutions.

Dr. Maria L. Silveira became the Director of Research at the Noble Research Institute in June 2025, following a 19-year tenure as a Professor of Grassland Biogeochemistry at the University of Florida's Range Cattle Research and Education Center. Her research has focused on sustainable grazing land ecosystems, addressing soil health, nutrient management, water quality, carbon sequestration, and greenhouse gas mitigation. Over her career, she has published extensively, secured over \$24 million in competitive grants, and mentored numerous graduate students and postdoctoral researchers.

Dr. Silveira is an active member of several professional societies and has served in editorial roles for major journals such as Agronomy Journal and Crop Science. She has also led national research initiatives, including chairing the USDA multistate project W4170 and directing the UF/Archbold LTAR Network site. Her work has earned her numerous accolades, including being named a Soil Science Society of America Fellow and receiving the Florida Cattlemen's Association Research of the Year Award.


